## **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course will help prepare students for life after graduating from Rutgers. Students will learn about some of the different career paths available to Environmental Sciences majors by hearing directly from some of our past alumni and professionals working in the field. Students will learn how to present themselves and their accomplishments in a professional manner orally and in writing to build their confidence when applying for graduate school, their first internship, and/or job.

# **COURSE LEARNING GOALS:**

This class will contribute toward students' ability to:

- Communicate effectively orally and in writing.
- Present their professional and academic skills and accomplishments in job and graduate school application materials, online, and during the interview process.

# **GRADING AND ATTENDANCE POLICY:**

- Grading will be based on in-class attendance and participation. Students are expected to come to class prepared to engage in discussion, practice speaking, and participate in the peer review process. More than one unexcused absence will result in a drop of one letter grade.
- Students are expected to arrive to class on time. Starting Week 3, arriving to class >10 min late will result in an absence and loss of points for that day. Exceptions will be allowed for emergencies and arrangements made ahead of time.
- Phones and other electronic devices must be put away during the duration of class, unless invited to use them by the speaker or instructor. If you must use your phone during the class period, please step out into the hallway while doing so.

**Reflection essays:** Students will write two essays (~250 words) to reflect on what they have learned. In Essay 1 (due after Week 8) students will reflect on the type of professions and careers they are considering post-graduation and discuss how hearing from alumni and professionals in the field has informed their decision. In Essay 2 (~250 words), due after the first mock interview, students will reflect on the skills they have learned in the interview process and aspects they hope to improve during the second round of interviews recorded on Zoom.

**Cover letter & resume:** Students will prepare a resume and cover letter for a specific job or internship opportunity found on Handshake, LinkedIn, or other job search platform. Instructor and peer review feedback will be provided using a rubric. Full credit will be given for adequate completion of a resume and cover letter, and participation in the peer review process.

**Mock Interviews:** At the conclusion of the semester, students will practice the job interview process in two types of mock interviews. The first will be in class where students will each take turns being the interviewer and interviewee. The second interview session will be online and conducted by an instructor or guest interviewer and recorded for later review by the student. Full credit will be given to students who participate in both interviews and the peer review process.
